## BETTER

Than the School Hack is the Method of Trustee Shank in Getting Children To and From School

HACKS

John U. Shanks, trustee of Carrollton township, has again gained publicity by an innovation he has made in the manner of transporting children to and from school. Carrollton township has but two schools, one at Wheeling and one at Gravel Hill, both of which are departmental. Three years ago, a school hack gathered up the children and took them to and from the school. Often the children had to walk to the cross-roads to meet the hack and in the evening they were late in arriving home. Mr. Shanks conceived the idea of paying the parents 15 cents for the transportation of each child, instead of paying a hack driver. A large covered shed has been built at Wheeling and one is now being constructed at Gravel Hill. The children drive to school and have a convenient place under cover for their conveyances. By this arrangement, the parents worry less than they did when a hack driver had charge of their children, the children arrive home sooner after school and the township is at less expense. Mr. Shanks was visited this week by a Cass county trustee who expects to follow Mr. Shank's lead and do away with the school-wagons.

On the opening day of the Gravel Hill school a dedication celebration will be held and all the patrons of the school are invited to come.
